Technology Education 7-12

Family Consumer Science 7-12

offers students an introduction to managing the challenges of living and working by focusing on foods and nutrition, child care and development, textiles and design, as well as consumerism.

WCS UA Humanities

The Humanities course offers students the introduction to global interactions by learning about certain cultural aspects of societies and global interconnectedness while giving students the opportunity to begin exploring language learning. This class will discuss various fields of the Humanities before moving into the exploration of the Spanish and French languages.

Music

Music education in Windham provides our students performance groups as well as general music class, our objective is to expose them to musical practices that will enable inner growth and development. These musical experiences serve as a catalyst for higher-level and critical thinking as well as the development of problem solving skills.

The music program in the Windham School District provides a well-rounded education that is filled with high quality performance opportunities as well as a safe environment to create music, challenge themselves, and be self-expressive.

Elementary Music

All students are enrolled in weekly music class that focus on the development of rudimentary and fundamental musical skills. The program also focuses greatly on developing social skills, creative and critical thinking skills, and a life-long appreciation for music. Students collaborate in music exploration in a variety of activities including:

- Ear Training, Vocal training, and Interpretation of music
- Performance etiquette and techniques both in concerts and on Baroque recorders
- Introduction of music theory/reading skills and music history.

Middle School Music

Music Appreciation – Offers students a variety of musical experiences by listening to, watching, and performing music. Students are exposed to a wide range of musical styles and are able to explore its relationship to society and culture. Hands-on experiences allow students to be fully engaged in their musical learning.

Band and Choir - The band and choir program provides students a place to enhance their musicianship, develop team-building skills, and promote citizenship. Students work on technical skills on their instrument, performance skills in

voice, and contribute to their grade level ensemble on a daily basis. Extra-curricular ensembles such as Honors Band, Jazz Band, Select Choir, and Jazz Choir are available to students through audition, providing enrichment opportunities for all musicians.

Visual Art

Visual art is a vital and basic component in human development. Through creative experiences, Visual art allows the maker and viewer to increase positive attitudes towards self, others, and the environment.
